Cogeneration

Of all Europe's tools for improving energy efficiency and reducing CO₂ emissions cogeneration (Combined Heat and Power or CHP) is one of the lowest risk and most far reaching in near term impact. Eleven percent of Europe's electricity today is produced using cogeneration and an estimated additional 150 GWe of European cogeneration potential remains to be exploited. Specifically highlighted as a key energy efficiency technology in the 'EU 2020' Strategy (November 2010), cogeneration has European Union support for growth: it is a strategic energy choice for Europe.

Conference

The Conference will highlight the major challenges facing this sector. European cogeneration has a key role to play in helping Europe reach its energy efficiency target of 20% in 2020. The review of the Cogeneration Directive with the Energy Efficiency Plan feature high on the EU energy policy agenda in 2011. The Conference brings together in Brussels the strongest advocates and the most influential thinkers to highlight the significant role which energy efficiency and cogeneration in particular must play in reaching strategic EU energy goals. The theme of the one-day Conference is "Cogeneration at the foundation of Europe's energy policy" and we will be focusing on policy developments, market potentials and best practice examples.

Agenda

The morning session of the Conference will bring together energy professionals to discuss the challenges and contributions of cogeneration in EU energy policy. Speakers (confirmed) include: Marie Donnelly (European Commission), Richard Cowart (RAP) and Gérard Magnin (Energy Cities).
